

A message from Liz Marshall: "Last June, on the rainiest day I can remember, I volunteered for the Ride for Roswell. I complained the whole time, because it was so cold and miserable, and it felt as though our group was doing the hardest work, getting muddy and drenched. I stayed the whole day, though, because I thought we were doing something humanitarian and "for the cause." I had NO idea what it meant to "fight against cancer."

And then one day last December, I learned I have breast cancer. After 7 years of working with and around doctors and researchers from UB and Roswell Park, they were suddenly working for me and with me, to fight MY cancer. My team of nurses, doctors, techs, and everyone have been phenomenal since my first visit.

This year, although at times I still can't believe it, there's a team with my name on it, and I know all too well what it means to fight this ridiculous disease.

One day, there might not be cancer-- but until then- please help Roswell in their fight to make that possible. Join Team Let's Get Lizzycle! Or give what you can! Or just send positivity and strength my way-- it means more than I can say. Thank you for all the love and support along the way."

UPDATE: Liz had her surgery on May 19th, and by all accounts she sailed through it with flying colors. She and Jarrett are looking forward to being back with us soon!.



Prepared to Serve: Licensed Ministries in the Diocese of Western New York

Do you feel called to serve the Church in a broader way? Does your worshiping community affirm that call?

As a lay person there are many ways you can serve God and the Church. Prepared to Serve deals with lay ministries that require special training, education and licensing.

You must seek special training within your parish or deanery to become licensed as a Eucharistic Minister, (a lay person authorized to administer the consecrated elements at a Celebration of the Holy Eucharist) or a Eucharistic Visitor (a lay person authorized to take the consecrated elements to members of the congregation who were unable to be present at the celebration of the Eucharist because of illness or infirmity. Both of these ministries are recognized within the canons of the Episcopal Church.

Several additional licensed ministries are recognized in the canons. They require substantial standardized training and preparation that is best handled at the diocesan level. These are:

- Pastoral Leader Parish Administrator
- Pastoral Leader Pastoral Care Minister
- Worship Leader
- Preacher
- Catechist
- Evangelist

The training for these ministries requires a commitment of personal time as well as financial commitment. Congregations are encouraged to share in this financial commitment.
