## **Wanted- Volunteers for the Audit Committee**

Every congregation in the Diocese is required to submit an annual audit or statement of review of their books by October 1.Good Shepherd is allowed to conduct a review by Committee, thus saving us the cost of an audit.

You do not have to be an accountant or an auditor to serve on an audit committee but each member of an audit committee should have "sufficient financial skills and experience" to conduct the review. Are you comfortable with numbers, balancing your checkbook and understand the concept of a budget? You can do this! Please speak to Pat Lalonde about this important ministry. The review typically takes an evening to complete and the tasks and instructions are clear and easy to understand.
