Unfortunately, after several attempts, repairs were not successful to the exterior lights at the Nativity window. Replacement would be cost-prohibitive, so the lights will be removed within the next few weeks.

According to the Book of Acts, the arrival of the Holy Spirit was accompanied by dramatic, supernatural signs:



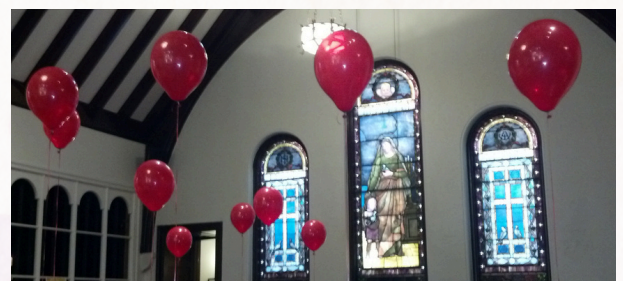
