St. Francis Garden



After consulting with four different landscaping companies, it was determined that due to many years of neglect the weeping cherry and holly bush were dying and could not be saved. Additionally, this garden and several others on the property have been overtaken by invasive weeds. We have engaged a landscaping company to weed and mulch the planting beds. In the area of the St. Francis garden, there is a leaking drainpipe that needs to be fixed before anything is replanted. We welcome your input before replanting. Electrical Issues

We have replaced an electrical subpanel in the basement that provides power to the north side of the church and should prevent further electrical problems with the organ.

Unfortunately, after several attempts, repairs were not successful to the exterior lights at the Nativity window. Replacement would be cost-prohibitive, so the lights will be removed within the next few weeks.
